









A Multiple-stage Semester System offers flexibility to students of different abilities



Depending on Abilities, Students may study:



A variety of programs meets students' diversified needs

Junior Middle School (Grades 7 and 8)

- Students with at least primary 6 are eligible to apply to Junior Middle School (JMS)
- Offers special custodianship services to young students

High School (Grades 9-12)

- Form 2/ Sec. 1/ Junior Middle 2 or higher may apply
- Graduates receive Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- Offers co-op placements to explore potential careers

Pre-University Program

- Prepares students for admission to universities in Canada, USA, Australia, New Zealand, and the U.K.
- Students now studying in Form 5, Sec. 4, 'O' Level, are eligible to apply to the 6-month program (January or Mid-May intake); allows the completion of 6 credits
- Senior Middle 2 students are eligible to apply for a minimum 10-month program (August intake); allows students to complete 8 credits and graduate with an OSSD

Advanced Placement Program

- Offers post-secondary level courses and examinations to Pre-U students
- Accepted by more than 90% of Canadian and USA universities
- Maximum number of credits accepted depends on:
- Grades achieved (3, 4 or 5)
- Courses approved by faculty and university

ESL Program

- Builds upon and strengthens students' understanding of English in preparation for academic courses at CIC and at universities / colleges
